Keeping Our Community Safe: Latest Government Guidance

The information below was released on 23rd September, the full letter can be viewed on the Coronavirus section of the website.

You should only book a test if your child has any of these three coronavirus symptoms:

1. a high temperature: any new high temperature where your child feels hot to touch on their chest or back (you do not need to measure the temperature)

2. a new continuous cough: coughing a lot for more than an hour, or three or more coughing episodes in 24 hours

3. a loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste: a noticeable loss of smell or taste or things smell and taste different to normal

- Your child does not need a test if they have a runny nose, are sneezing or feeling unwell but do not have a temperature, cough or loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste because these are not normally symptoms of coronavirus.

They should not attend school if you have any of the three main symptoms, you will need to arrange for a test; the Covid section on our website will direct you to phone numbers and the process for acquiring a test and returning to school.

Should you find yourself having to remain at home, please access your child's class page on the website where you will find home learning ideas, these should then be uploaded to SeeSaw to allow the class teacher to respond and support.

Warm Clothing

As we move into the colder weather please ensure that your child has a school jumper/cardigan at all times and when in outdoor PE kit that this is black leggings/joggers and a black or green sweatshirt.
