Please ensure that children have coats with them at all times, the current collection and drop off system will remain in place for some time and this will mean the children may be stood outside for longer than usual whilst being collected. For children wearing wellies when walking to and from school please provide a plastic bag for the wellies to be stored under their table during the school day.
